## PRESENTATION OF ESSEC IRÉNÉ & SIRENE

The Institute for Research and Education on Negotiation, established at ESSEC Business School in 1996, pursues three missions. The first one focuses on our academic goals and aims at *developing theoretical and applied research* in the fields of negotiation, mediation and conflict resolution. The second consists in *sharing operational concepts through participative trainings* which mobilise case studies and simulations; for instance, since 2004, the European Commission (DG HR) has asked ESSEC IRÉNÉ to design and deliver a Negotiation Training Path for EC officials. The third mission is *fieldwork*, *especially in fragile states and post-conflict societies:* mediation, facilitation, and capacity building missions are at the core of our "Negotiators of the World" programme, in Burundi, DRC or the Horn of Africa. So far, ESSEC IRÉNÉ has conducted operations in 53 countries.

In this spirit, IRÉNÉ has organised since 2007 an **interdisciplinary research seminar on negotiation** (SIRENE). Research is a key issue for negotiation insofar as it contributes to the generation of original concepts, the academic recognition of this multidisciplinary field and, through PhD students, the emergence of a new generation of researchers. To achieve these objectives, the exchange between researchers as well as between researchers, trainers and practitioners, offers a stimulating path. Negotiation needs places and moments in which ideas cross-fertilize, and where best practices are shared. SIRENE is open for those who want to contribute to collective reflection on negotiation, its stakes and its challenges. Participants come from many different academic institutions such as CERI, Cleveland State University, CNAM, CNRS, ENSTA, ESSEC, European University Institute (Florence), ESC Lille, ESCP, INSA (Lyon), INSEAD, Negocia, Polytechnique, Sciences Po Paris, Sciences Po Lille, Universities of Paris (I, II, V, VIII, IX), of Liege, Lyon III, Montréal, Sherbrooke, University of Minnesota, of Stanford, The Hague, Tilburg, etc.
